These Conditions of Sale together with the Bid Sheet and any glossary contained in this Printed Catalog, as may be amended by announcement, constitutes the complete terms and conditions on which all property shall be offered for sale by Pete deCoux. (the "House").

This is a telephone and mail bid sale. All bids must be made by LOT Number as listed in the Printed Catalog and be received by the House not later than the Sale Close as below, be made in United States of America Funds and follow the Bidding Increment Schedule as listed in the Printed Catalog. Only registered catalog buyers will be permitted to bid.

The Sale Close shall be at 10:00 PM Mountain Standard Time on the day, month, and year of "close date of the Sale" as listed on the Catalog and Bid Sheet.

The House reserves the right to reject any bid from any bidder. The highest bidder acknowledged by the House shall be the Buyer. In the event of any dispute between bidders, the House shall have sole and final discretion either to determine the successful bidder or to re-offer and resell the article in dispute. In case of tie bids preference will be given to the bid bearing the earliest postmark. If any dispute arises after the Sale, the House's sale record shall be conclusive in all respects. If the Buyer gives notice in writing to the House that any lot sold is wrong, and if within fourteen (14) days after such notice the Buyer returns the lot to the House in the same condition as when sold, and proves to the satisfaction of the House that the returned lot is in fact wrong and this was not indicated by a fair reading of the Printed Catalog, the sale will be rescinded and the Purchase Price thereof refunded.

No bid can be withdrawn once made. There are no exceptions.

Great care is taken to ensure that any statement as to authorship, attribution, origin, date, age, provenance and condition is reliable and accurate, but all such statements are statements of opinion and are not to be taken as statements or representation of fact. All property is sold "as is" and neither the House nor the Consignor makes any warranties or representations of any kind or nature with respect to the property. Furthermore, the House reserves the right, in forming opinion, to consult and rely upon any expert or authority reasonably considered by the House to be reliable.

As used in these Conditions of Sale the term "Final Bid" means either the highest

acknowledged bid or the Reduction Bid as defined below, whichever is least, and the term "Purchase Price" means the aggregate of the Final Bid plus fifteen percent (15%) of the Final Bid (the "Premium") and any applicable State and local sales tax and any compensating use tax of another state which the House may be required by law to collect.

All lots sold must be removed at the Buyer's expense and the Purchase Price thereof paid in UNITED STATES OF AMERICA FUNDS not later than thirty (30) days following the date of the Sale. And unless prior arrangements have been made unpaid lots will be subject to a late charge of 2% per month. The House will help to arrange to deliver any lot, provided instructions are given, the Purchase Price is paid in full, and all postage, packing, insurance or other fees incurred by the House are paid in full.

In these Conditions of Sale the term "Reduction Bid" means the sum, rounded up to the nearest increment as listed in the Printed Catalog, over the second highest acknowledged bid.

Deposits of unsuccessful bidders will be promptly returned after the date of the Sale.

All lots will be available for inspection BY APPOINTMENT ONLY, unless a public preview is otherwise announced. All cartridges are for collecting purposes only.

The House reserves the right to withdraw any lot at any time before the date of the sale.

If the House is prevented by fire, theft, or any other reason whatsoever from delivering any lot to the Buyer, the liability of the House shall be limited to the Purchase Price actually paid thereof. The respective rights and obligations of the parties in respect to the Conditions of Sale and the conduct of the auction shall be governed and interpreted by the laws of the State of Arizona, and the bidder hereby submits to the jurisdiction of the courts of such state.

ADVICE TO BIDDERS

FIRST review the entire catalog; we may not have put the lots you want where you expect them to be.

Estimates- We have included a price range that we think the lot will sell within. However, they are only estimates, and a lot may sell above or below the estimate. So don't let an estimate stop you from bidding because you think it's too high. Bid what you are willing to pay.

Bidding- Determine how much you are willing to pay and bid that price, as your bid may win because all lots are sold as cheaply as other bids allow, as this is a "reduction bid" auction. Bid early; the earliest postmark is the winner in case of tie bids. You can call back and check or adjust your bids or bid on other lots by telephone towards the end. See the inside back cover for the auction close procedure and bid even if you feel you have no chance of success; you may get a bargain.

Bidding by Mail- Just fill out the Fax or Mail bid sheet by listing the lot number and your maximum bid for that lot, sign it, include your deposit information and get it to us so we receive it before the close date. Remember we do not have any control over delivery of your bid so we suggest you do it as soon as possible as bid sheets received after the close date will not be considered.

Bidding by Fax- Just the same as by mail, fill it out, sign it, and Fax it to our 24 hour Fax number 928-776-8276 so we receive it no later than **4:00 PM** MST on the date of the close.

Bidding by E-mail- Electronically duplicate the asked for information contained on the bid sheet and send it. Note the times we will not accept E-mail bids, as published on the inside back cover of the catalog.

Bidding by Telephone- You may place any number of bids any number of times during the sale. No written bid is required prior to placing telephone bids during the hours of 10:00 AM to 7:00 PM MST Monday - Friday. You may also add, raise and / or check if you are high. Starting the Thursday before the Close the auctioneer will give you the second high bid as a starting point, and tell you if your bid is the high. He will not provide any other information about bids. And please remember too, within three (3) business days after the close, send us your signed Phone Conformation bid sheet confirming your bids.

Checking your Bids- You may check any number of times. The auctioneer will tell you if you're high. You are then free to raise on any number of bids or bid on other lots.

Auction Close- Ten (10:00) PM MST time on the date published in the catalog. So until 10:00 PM on the auction close date if you call and get a busy signal redial, until you succeed and we will continue to take your bids. When you call and make connection be aware we have two telephone lines and a device that will let you know you have connected with us and it will put you on hold until we are finished with the bidder ahead of you. It will then be your turn. So if you get this recording stay on the line as you are next. The wait should be short as we try to make each call as short as possible. However you can hang up and redial at a later time provided the auction is still in progress. Should you call after 10:00 PM when the auction is over you will get a recording saying so.

After the Sale- We will be preparing the winning prices. We realize you are anxious to know if you were successful, so should you wish to call about this information

please do so starting Monday between 10 AM to 7 PM as we will not accept calls at other times or on Sunday. Final results will be mailed to all catalog buyers. Included with this mailing will be detailed invoices for winning bidders. Unsuccessful bidders will have their deposits returned.

Payment- We accept PayPal **ONLY for overseas or Canadian buyers (you pay all fees, use: ctgs@commspeed.net and the gift payment button)** We are again taking U.S. bank credit cards, but prefer personal checks, money orders and bank drafts only if payment is made in United States Funds. Other payments drawn on foreign banks may be subject to a \$25.00 or more fee. Arizona residents must pay appropriate sales tax.

Extended Payment- Provided prior arrangements are made extended payments can be arranged. If you really want something we will try to work out a plan for you to participate. We can also accept items in trade against your balance provided prior arrangements are made. Questions? Call !

Delayed Payments- Things do not always go as expected, we are aware of that. We would appreciate, if something unexpected happens, that you let us know as soon as possible so we can take appropriate action. We expect payment in full within thirty (30) days from the invoice date. If you do not inform us and delay in paying us there is a late charge of 2% per month and we will be forced to require a 100% cash advance of your bid in future auctions.

Delivery- We will try to ship your order soon after the purchase price is paid in full. We ship by Fed-X and must have your phone number and physical street address. Minimum shipping is \$17.00 and includes insurance only for your purchase price. We cannot ship live ammunition or primers by mail, so overseas, Canadian and other than continental United States buyers must make other arrangements. We will be glad to work with you on this by storage or shipment to another. Please contact us for details.

Problems- Contact us as soon as possible if anything is wrong with anything so we can rectify the problem. Please be sure to give us a daytime telephone number.

Comments

Regarding our descriptions of the quality and condition of the items in this catalog, we try to be honest with you as buyer, as we too, are often buyers. We try to rate the item in an overall condition then note any flaws. We understand that each of you has different criteria that often make an item acceptable or not. Therefore to make our ratings understood we will say that an item rated as fair is one we feel most collectors would put away with the hope of upgrading and that the most discriminating of you would not purchase the item at all due to a high percentage of missing label, poor patina, dirt, corrosion, no charge or badly cracked neck. A good item is one that, although it does have some of what we consider slight, minor flaw(s), you could live with and still enjoy. Very good shouldn't be any problem to 98% of you. Excellent to near mint a very minor distinction, and mint is as new, without being new. Should you have any further questions we will be glad to help with more detailed information about an item(s) as best we can.

Regarding our comments about rarity we can only go with what we have encountered in other collections, at gun and cartridge shows and in various auctions and lists. Our rarity ratings are based on the frequency we have seen or read about the item in question. Your exposure may be entirely different.

Regarding the photographs, we show the worst "side" and are photographing items (as close as we can,) actual size. If an item is not, the text will show in the percentage we reduced or magnified.

Please read the whole catalog as a lot you desire might be in different section than you think.

To those of you who undertook the massive task of authoring the books we use and to all of you who took the time and effort to answer our questions, Thank you, we couldn't have done it without you.

We hope you will be successful with your bids and satisfied with the lots you won. We have made every effort to give accurate descriptions regarding the who, what, why, etc., and hope this effort is of use to you.

The following abbreviations are being used for bullet jacket materials in the catalog.

GM = gilding metal

GMCS = gilding metal clad steel

CN = cupronickel

CNCS = cupronickel clad steel

and CL = case length

OAL = over all length

NOTE: This is a reduction bid auction, spread bids are of no use as your high bid is reduced to an increment above the next highest bidder (or not, if it is a tie bid). Also please pay attention to the bid increments at the top of your bid sheet *because your bid will be reduced if it does not conform to the increments and you might loose the lot !*

Please note that the minimum bid on any lot is \$15.00.

Regarding reserves: Please consider any lot with a \$300.00 [or higher] low estimate figure, as having the low estimate value, used as a reserve value guide.

Please note we are not an all reserve house, however we do have a minimum bid.

EARLY & TRANSITIONAL

1 With an orange base sticker printed 'ELEY'S Needle Gun Cartridge. 110', and a tan paper outer wrap with a vertical seam, the round nosed cast lead bullet is held by a white paper patch. The only variation of these we know of with a { .38" over the } patched bullet, it has been lightly lacquered but is still in good to very good condition. *estimate- 20-40*



2 With a blue base sticker printed off center and showing only 'ELEY Needle G Cartridge', this has a vertical seamed tan paper outer wrap over the brass body, and a pointed cast lead bullet. A .40 cal. example is in very good to excellent condition. *estimate- 20-40*



3 The circa 1853 .36 Marston pistol, had two things going for it. First the leather base with a central perforation acting as a central flash hole and the leather also acting as breech seal. The central flash hole was an important development and the leather also acted to clean the bore as it stayed in and was pushed out of the bore ahead of the next round's projectile. Showing the leather base, a blue/green colored paper body and a partially oxidized, grooved lead bullet which is loose, but we think it still contains the charge. In otherwise excellent condition. *estimate- 250-350*



4 With some dark stained grease on the paper covering the area of the cylindrical lead bullet, and a 2-piece white paper body showing diagonal seams this .450 Whitworth has it's tail twisted and laid up along the side. Perhaps a Pattern 1852 variation it has a few small bites to the edge of the outer paper at one corner but it is still in very condition. *estimate- 200-300*



5 This .52 Sharps Linen has a lacquered paper base, a white linen body with a vertical seam and a lead bullet. With light soil it is in very good condition. *estimate- 30-50*



6 A .58 Johnson & Dow made U.S. rifle musket made with paper then waterproofed, strengthened and glued to the lead bullet base by collodion. It has one slight split, and a long one at the mouth along with a thin mid-case crack, but still seems solid, so in relatively good condition. *estimate- 50-80*



7 This salmon paper .58 Musket has the tail gathered and then laid along the side while the mouth has been gathered and folded over the tan string. With a Williams patent Type III bullet, it has light soil, a short partial opening at the 'Clean-out' and is otherwise in very good to excellent condition. *estimate- 90-120*



8 This .69 Buck and Ball uses a tan string to tie the mouth, contain and separate the upper 3 Buck shot from the round lead Ball and hold the ball to the powder charge. The diagonally wrapped tan paper has the tail neatly folded at the base three times and laid along the side. Weighing 642 gr. and with only very light soil it is in excellent condition. *estimate- 150-200*



9 This .69 Flintlock M-1837 {probable} Hingham Arsenal, Massachusetts is without powder. The cast lead round ball is tied above and below it's circumference with tan string. The light brown paper shows a diagonal seam. When these are found loaded they often have different loadings, thus different over all lengths. This round appears never loaded and the tail now tapers to a flat. It has a slight wrinkle on one side and light wear to the tail's end, still it is in very good condition. *estimate- 90-120*



10 ⇒ Still sealed, this black printed, shellacked tan paper wrapped split wooden block style Colt's, .31 Cal. Pocket Pistol packet would have been opened by pulling it's brass wire at the top right side. More often seen as a 5-size, this 6-size, "Made of Hazards Powder" is in near mint condition. *estimate- 400-500*



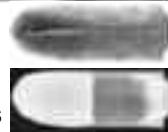
⇐ **11** ⇒ With 5 original .56 Merrill cartridges, this tan paper sleeve and tray box has cellotape around the tray and on both sides of the top. The top side of the sleeve is open and the label has soil. The rounds have light soil and are in good to very good condition. [box photo 75%] *estimate- 300-400*



12 This set of **3 original labels** are on black printed tan or brownish paper. The .50 Smith's is by Poultney & Trimble, the .54 Starr Linen is by Johnson & Dow, and the .54 Burnside is by Burnside. With a few edge bites and light soil these are in good condition. [photo 50%] *estimate-* 20-40



13 Unheadstamped, and with two extra lead bullets, this **.307 Schneeloch Triangular** uses a copper Allen percussion cap as a primer, and has a drawn brass case. The only known firearm is a modified Smith & Wesson No. 1 Pistol and this is covered under the Dec. 31, 1872, U.S. patent #134,442. The bullet's sides show a left hand twist, while the case appears to be without twist. With a few slight dents this quite rare cartridge is in good condition. *estimate-* 1200-1500



14 Copper cased with two-band lead bullets these **two Allen's Lip Fires** are a No. 50, and a No. 52 (.25 and .32 caliber). Unheadstamped, both have been lacquered and perhaps lightly polished otherwise they are both in good condition. *estimate-* 20-40



15 In poor condition this lacquered **.31 Milbank primed front loader** has a copper primer, a lead bullet, and a badly split / cracked brass case which is missing a piece. Also in this lot are two **Theur's**, a **.36 Navy** and a **.44**, both with copper percussion caps as primers, brass cases and oxidized lead bullets. The Theurs are in good condition. *estimate-* 50-70



16 An **12 or 11 mm Raphael**, inside primed, with a drawn brass case and a lightly oxidized lead bullet this is the 'standard' round that saw use during the Civil War. With marker and toning it is in good condition. *estimate-* 120-170



17 This **.44 Dustbin** includes two lead bullets with long pointed sprues. The .444" round variation has a white felt wad on the sprue, while the cast .435" grooved example is without a wad. The new empty 2-piece copper case has 4 partial slits along the body creating tension to help secure the lid, and a center-held flat nose, while the domed 'lid' is unmarked. When loading, the sprue or tail would be held to the case by bending it over inside the case. We believe this case is a period, patent infringement example of the 1852 Adam's Patent #1 as made and marked by Eley. The 'tailed' bullet was a slightly earlier 1851 Adam's Patent, #3033 and was only in use for a very short time. With the 'lid' removed before loading / firing, this uncommon case has marker and all-in-all, everything is in good to very good condition. *estimate-* 300-400



18 This **.42 caliber Rifle** is thought likely to be a Lancaster. It has an inside primed center fire plain copper base, a vertically seamed brown paper body and a lead bullet. The base has a dent to one side and the body two other dents. The bullet appears somewhat choke-crimped into the mouth and other than the dents, it is in good condition. *estimate-* 120-170



19 An unusual revolver round, the **11.15x14R Javelle** has a molded, lead case and a better than average raised 'J' headstamp. The inside primed case with an internal firing pin is covered under a 1859 French patent. The cartridge has no oxidation, bright patina, and shows the typical swelling at base. With marker on the case it is in good to very good condition. *estimate-* 250-350



20 An 1860 model **.50 Gallager**, this has a dished hole in the center of the rounded head, a **brass case** and a lead bullet. With light lead oxidation, a few case dings and uneven toning, it is still in good condition. *estimate-* 70-100



21 A pair of **.54 Burnside's**. Both brass cases have the Foster grease groove, and lead bullets. The upper has a conventional rounded base with a tapered, dished central hole and the lower has a flatter base with a wide shallow dish around the center hole. Some consider the lower example to be a variation, but we (and Jim Tillinghast) believed this indicated a fired case caused by the shape of the carbine chamber. Both have uneven toning and marker while the 'flat base' example has several case dents, so generally in good condition. *estimate-* 60-90



22 Resembling a Pauly shotshell this has an iron nipple set into the rounded head of the thick-walled brass case, this early, unknown to us, about **.61 cal. percussion camber** has been fired, has a slightly out-of-round mouth, a few dents / dings and darkish toning, still it is in reasonably good condition. *estimate-* 150-200



23 A 13x87 R Mitrailuese 1870. For a 37 barrel volley gun adopted by the French in 1869, this variation is unheadstamped, has a brass primer with a loading mark and a brass battery cup, a .574" / 14.57mm brass head, a **green** paper case with a tan linen case mouth seal and white paper patched long lead bullet. The paper, and part of the linen patch is split, otherwise it is in good condition. *estimate-* 70-100



24 Unheadstamped, this .56-50 **Spencer Martin primed** center fire has the early ca. 1868-69 type rim, which is without the reentrant fold. A number of old, unevenly impressed and unevenly spaced parallel lines show in the copper case and head [a draw die?]. The lead bullet is heavily oxidized and the case has uneven toning otherwise it is in good condition. *estimate-* 250-350



25 This **11-piece collection** of pistol rounds includes three Martin primed examples: a .50 Remington Army, and two variations of the .44 S&W Army. The Benét primed are: one .50 Remington Navy with a magnetic cup and two .50 Rem. Army, two .44 Colt & Remington, two .45 S&W Schofield {or Colt Government}, and one .45 Colt. With perhaps minor differences, most have marker and typical oxidation. Generally in good to very good condition. [no photo] *estimate-* 60-90

26 A **No. 1 Eagle Arms Co. box** holding 30, plain copper-cased lead bullet .28 cup-fire rounds showing the rounded cup. The 2-piece half-cover green box has an about 65% complete plain orange side seal, and a black-printed, green top label with a corner bite. The top is missing both ends, and may have once been celloaped. Listing two patent dates, July 17, 1859 and a July 21, 1863 re-issue. The rounds are in good condition with typical lead oxidation. The box bottom is still strong with an open corner and this is in fair to good condition. [photo 70%] *estimate-* 150-200



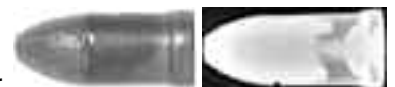
27 ⇨ Empty, this very attractive orange 2-piece half-cover **No. 1 Williamson's (Flat) Teat Fire box** lists a Jan. 5th, 1864 patent {his first}, and has a plain dark red side seal which is perhaps 90-95% complete. The top label is black with slight faint gold print. It shows some small scuffs and tiny edge bites. The bottom and the top each have one open corner, but it is still in good condition. [photo 70%] *estimate-* 250-300



⇐ **28** Still sealed, this 1878 **.45 Revolver box by Frankford Arsenal** has an intact string-pull opener. The top appears to be double printed but is a mirror image, so perhaps it was laid face to face with another box of the same date? In excellent condition. [photo 70%] *estimate-* 400-500

PINFIRE

29 This **9mm French Thick Rim horizontal pinfire** appears to have a brass pin, while the drawn copper case has a 2-piece exterior, and a cast-lead bullet. Made to the thicker Perrin sized rim, it has a uneven toning and is in good condition. *estimate-* 150-200



30 This **4-piece collection** of brass cased **9mm's by Keller & Co.** include ball load with an impressed headstamp, plus a blank with a tapered crimp holding the white topwad and two shot loads with **raised headstamps**. The shot loads both have salmon paper sabots and white topwads but the 9's in the headstamps are different. One shot load is dirty and has a dent in the mouth, otherwise these are all in good to very good condition. *estimate-* 20-40



31 With a plain dark blue paper body and a 3/8" brass head, this new empty 16 ga. shell is 2 1/2" long. Headstamped ' **V. L & D No NEW-YORK 16** ', it has a coiled-steel inner reinforcing, light toning and is in very good condition. *estimate-* 25-40



32 With a somewhat faint, raised ' **EM. REILLY & C(?) 15 LONDON G.** ' headstamp, this lacquered 2 1/4" brownish-salmon paper shell has a 3/16" brass head and a plain but somewhat dirty off-white topwad held with a roll crimp. It is believed the "G" in the headstamp is the hull makers mark of Gevelot, Paris. A very uncommon gauge, the body has a deep but somewhat small dent, still it is in good condition. *estimate-* 150-200



33 Headstamped with a raised ' **ELEY BROS 8 LONDON** ', this 3¹/₈" green paper 1st quality handloaded shell has "PATENT GAS-TIGHT CARTRIDGE" black case print, a roll crimp holding a white topwad showing a handwritten "4", and a 3/8" brass head with magnetic inner reinforcing. With light toning to the head and a flaw in the headstamped "8", which now looks somewhat like a "3". In good condition. *estimate-* 40-60



34 Unmarked, this rare 2¹¹/₁₆" steel **12 ga. Adams** cartridge has an angled nipple set on a rounded, flat-backed post which would fit into a cut-out in an unknown to us breech loading firearms chamber. Perhaps English patent #1147 of 1854, a "False breech-piece to contain charge"? Or #285, of 3 Feb., 1860, "Removeable plug converts breech-loading to muzzle-loading gun"? The size of the post where the nipple is fitted is to large for a pinfire, but could perhaps be a fit for the vent of a re-engineered flintlock. If anyone knows about this item, we would welcome the input. With dark but even toning and a tiny bit of rust it is in good fired condition. *estimate-* 400-500



MAYNARD

35 This set of **three .22 Maynard Model 1873** rounds includes one .22-10 {shown} headstamped ' OCCA 1983 ', which was made by the Oregon Cartridge Collectors Assoc. It has a small copper primer, a turned 1-piece brass case and like the following, a lead bullet. The other two [a .22-8 and a .22-10 {shown} size] have slight grooves in the head to assist removing the large copper primers, and non-magnetic 2-piece cases. All but the OCCA commemorative are counterfeit according to King, pg. 3. With toning and oxidation they are all in good condition. *estimate-* 30-50



36 A **.35-40 Model 1873**. It has a magnetic anvil, a brass primer and a 2-piece brass case with a .765" rim, a .402" mouth and a 2.142" length. The lead bullet is oxidized, and the case is dark but with nice color. In good condition. *estimate-* 40-60



37 A **.40-70 Model 1873**. It has a magnetic anvil, a brass primer with some marks, a 2-piece brass case with a .760" rim, a .453" mouth and a 2.455" length. The lead bullet is oxidized, and the case is unevenly toned. In good condition. *estimate-* 40-60



38 A **.44-70 Model 1873**. It has a magnetic anvil, a brass primer with some marks, a 2-piece brass case with a .762" rim, a .492" mouth and a 2.130" length. The cast lead bullet is lightly oxidized, and the case is unevenly toned. In good condition. *estimate-* 70-100



39 A **.44-100 Model 1873 Creedmore**. It has a magnetic anvil, a brass primer with a mark, a 2-piece **nickled** brass case with a .759" rim, a .492" mouth and a 2.890" length. The slightly loose paper patched lead bullet is not deeply seated, and has a few small bites to the patch. The head has a small "V" shaped notch, done before the plating, at the rims outer edge. In very good to excellent condition. *estimate-* 150-200



40 This **.55 Model 1873** is without a Berdan primer. It has a magnetic anvil, and a 2-piece brass case measuring: rim .770", mouth .581" and length 2.393". Apparently a Maynard .55 shot case with an oxidized lead bullet and no powder, the case is unevenly toned. With a stain at the mouth and a short hairline crack it is in good condition. *estimate-* 30-50



41 A **nickled .64 Maynard 1873 shot**. It has a not quite seated brass primer showing a mark, a magnetic anvil, and a 2-piece case holding a white topwad by friction. The wad has a handwritten "2" while the case is missing a small amount of plating, still it is in good condition. *estimate-* 40-60



42 Unheadstamped, this **.64 Model 1882 shot** has a struck large brass Boxer primer, an .815" rim, a .685" mouth and is 2.455" long. With uneven toning it is in good condition. *estimate-* 30-50

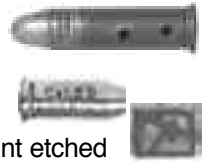


RIMFIRE

43 Unheadstamped, this, **thought to be English .22 LR** has a copper case with a base showing a raised cone shaped center in a dish, and a ringed head. The hollow point lead bullet is held with a choke crimp. With toning and oxidation it is in good condition. [head photo 200%] *estimate-* 15-25



44 Headstamped ' P ' {Kass P6 }, this **Peters .22 LR board dummy** has a burgundy anodized aluminum case with two mounting-holes, and a silver colored [Silvadry] lead bullet with some easily removed dark material. Rare, unique and very pretty, it is in excellent condition. *estimate-* 300-400



45 Steel, this **.22 RF gage** is in very good to excellent condition. Unheadstamped, it has 5 lines of black print etched in the body: "Cal.5,6" "1,27 Rebut" "5220.14" "233.0767" "(logo) 2_77". [logo enlarged & retouched to read easier] *estimate-* 60-90

46 This **7-piece** collection of raised headstamped **6mm Portee** includes three with the GG logo headstamp including a **dummy** with a drilled head, two with the CF logo headstamp, and two with the Acorn logo headstamp. All have brass heads, copper bodies and solid lead bullets of various shapes. Two have been polished and two have dents, {the dummy is shown}, otherwise these are in good to very good condition. *estimate-* 40-60



47 Headstamped ' 267 with a large "U" around the 6 ', this nickel plated brass **.267 Remington dummy** has a small hole .231" / 5.88mm from the base, a knurled cannellure and a lead bullet held by a taper crimp. In excellent condition. *estimate-* 50-80



48 This **.30 Long Merwin's Patent**, is unheadstamped and copper cased. U.S. patent #175,293 of March 28, 1876 was to prevent the head from swelling, particularly when fired in a revolver. This has a deep cone shaped dish in the base and may have been struck as it has a narrow rectangular dent in the rim. It has a slight dent or flaw in the case toward the mouth, and a slightly off-set lead bullet, otherwise it is in good condition. *estimate-* 50-80



49 A Union Metallic Cartridge Co. manufactured **.32 Long** with a **factory explosive bullet**. The copper case is unheadstamped and the lead bullet has a lead cap covering the explosive. The only known box label states "Manufactured under Smith & Wesson's Patent". This patent expired April 30, 1874 and this round was made before then. With marker and uneven toning it is in good condition. *estimate-* 30-50



50 This collection of **4 rounds** all have a **raised US headstamp**. They include: a .32 Long, a .38 Long, a .41 Long and a .44 Long Ballard [shown]. All have lead bullets, copper cases and the raised US is in an impressed circle. With marker and uneven toning these are all in good condition. *estimate-* 20-40



51 This inerted **.38 Long** has a **raised ' US (in an impressed circle) ' headstamp**, a copper case with a large mid-case hole and a belted lead bullet. The thick priming compound is white and the inside of the case has an even dark color. With bright exterior color it is in very good condition. *estimate-* 20-40



52 Headstamped ' U ', perhaps by Remington UMC, this **.38 Long factory dummy** has a copper case with a small mid-case hole and a lightly oxidized lead bullet. Without priming it shows typical factory polish which now has light toning, so in good to very good condition. *estimate-* 30-50



53 This **.38 Long by C. D. Leet** has a copper case and an oxidized 2-grooved lead bullet. With nice toning it is in good to very good condition. *estimate-* 30-50



54 Headstamped ' U ', this **.41 Short** has a copper case with a small "S-" impressed at the case mouth. The "S" is thought to note Smokeless and it is also known with just the dash, but the dash meaning is not yet known with certainty. With a lightly oxidized lead bullet and some small, slight stains it is in good condition. *estimate-* 25-40



55 Headstamped with a **raised ' P in a small impressed circle ' , this .41 Short** has a copper case and a lightly oxidized flat nosed lead bullet. In good condition. *estimate-* 20-40



56 Headstamped with a **raised ' H in an impressed circle , which is inside a slight raised ring ' , this .41 Swiss** has a shorter case length [1.493" / 37.93mm] than the later Winchester production with an impressed headstamp. With typical oxidation to the 2-groove lead bullet the case has slightly uneven toning. In good condition. *estimate-* 20-40



57 Headstamped with a **raised ' P in an impressed circle ' , this .44 Henry short flat** has a copper case and a 2-groove oxidized flat nosed lead bullet. With marker it is in good condition. *estimate-* 60-90



58 Headstamped with a **faint raised ' L&K in an impressed circle ' , this .44 Henry short flat** has a copper case and a 2-groove, oxidized flat nosed lead bullet. With faint marker it is in good condition. *estimate-* 100-150



59 Headstamped with a **raised 'H'** in an impressed circle, this **.44 Henry short flat** has a 2-groove oxidized flat nosed cast lead bullet. With marker and some glue residue to one side it is in good condition. *estimate- 20-40*



60 Headstamped with a **raised 'A'** in a small impressed circle, this **.44 Henry long flat** has a copper case and an oxidized flat nosed lead bullet with a knurled groove. The bullet has a few flat spots at the tip, otherwise this is in good condition. *estimate- 90-120*



61 Headstamped 'D', this **.44 Henry long flat** has a copper case and a lightly oxidized flat nosed belted lead bullet with a single groove. With uneven toning and marker, it is in good condition. *estimate- 20-40*



62 Headstamped with a slightly off-center **raised 'H'** in an impressed circle, this **.44 Henry long flat** has an oxidized flat nosed lead bullet with a single groove. In good condition. *estimate- 20-40*



63 Headstamped with a **raised 'H'**, **not in an impressed circle**, this **.44 Henry long flat** has a copper case and a lightly oxidized flat nosed lead bullet with a knurled groove. An uncommon headstamp, it has even toning and is in good condition. *estimate- 50-80*



64 This set of **two .44 Henry long flat** includes one stamped with a tiny 'US', while the other is stamped 'U'. Both have copper cases and lightly oxidized lead bullets, the US being belted, while the UMC has a single groove. The UMC [shown] has marker, lacquer and has been cleaned while the US is in good condition. *estimate- 30-50*



65 Headstamped with a **raised 'US'** in a large impressed circle, this **.44 Henry long flat** has a copper case and an oxidized, belted flat nosed lead bullet. With some black staining around the mouth it is in good condition. *estimate- 20-40*



66 Headstamped with a **raised 'H'** in an impressed circle, this **.44 Henry full case blank** has a grey paper wad seated .805" down from the mouth. This wad has a shellacked or brown lacquered seal at the outer edges, which was liberally applied from the case mouth. It has a total weight of 79 gr., some marker and a small rubbed area, otherwise it is in good condition. *estimate- 40-60*



67 Weighing 268.1 gr., this very rare **.44 Henry dummy** has an impressed 'H' headstamp, a copper case which seems to be without priming and a GM-jacketed flat nose bullet held by a taper crimp. With nice color it has a very small black stain at the rim and is in very good to excellent condition. *estimate- 400-500*



68 A pair of British rimfire includes: a **.442** and a **.340**. Both have typically somewhat faint raised **442** and **.340** headstamps, copper cases and lightly oxidized lead bullets. The **.340** has been lacquered and both have light toning, so in good condition. *estimate- 20-40*



69 Headstamped with a **raised 'G'**, this very uncommon double shot size **9mm Flobert dummy** has a copper head with two holes, one larger than the other, and a green and white patterned body holding the tan topwad with a roll crimp. With light toning it is in good to very good condition. *estimate- 25-40*



70 This set of **two 10.4 Swiss** rounds includes an unheadstamped copper cased rimfire with a single groove lead bullet, and a brass cased centerfire version. Unheadstamped, the centerfire has a round brass primer, a head with a beveled rim and a paper patched lead bullet secured with a segmented crimp. Both have marker, lightly oxidized bullets and are in good condition. *estimate- 30-50*



71 Unheadstamped, but showing **C. D. Leet** style tick marks on the base, this **.56 Starr** has a lead bullet showing two grease grooves. With a head diameter of .560", it is somewhat dark and unevenly toned but is in otherwise good condition. *estimate- 250-300*



72 Unheadstamped, this very uncommon United States Cartridge Co. **.56-46 "Extra" Long Spencer** [1.177" / 29.85mm case length] is the **high shoulder short neck** version. The head of the copper case has a narrow slightly raised ring around the wide slightly dished center and the lightly oxidized, belted lead bullet has a single groove. The case is lightly toned and shows where a small label once was. In good to very good condition. *estimate- 150-200*



73 Uncommon with a raised 'sAw' headstamp this .56-50 Spencer has a copper case with three segmented crimps and an oxidized lead bullet. With marker and uneven toning, it has one of the better headstamps we have seen with all the letters raised. In good condition. *estimate-* 100-150



74 This .56-52 Spencer shot load has a tan paper sabot, a copper case and a raised 'US' in an impressed circle 'headstamp. The case is somewhat unevenly toned and the sabot shows uneven color, still it is in good condition. *estimate-* 40-60



75 Somewhat faintly headstamped, this .58 Musket by Fitch, Van Vechten & Co. has a copper case and a lead bullet secured with a slight tapered crimp. With light toning and oxidization it is in good condition. *estimate-* 150-200



76 Very uncommon, if not rare, this .58 Roberts by Winchester Repeating Arms has a raised 'H' in an impressed circle 'headstamp, a copper case and an oxidized lead bullet held with a taper crimp. The case has marker and a couple of shallow dents, but it is still in good condition. *estimate-* 700-900



77 Faintly headstamped with an impressed '△', here is a circa 1960 - 1970 Swiss made 18 mm Milbank Amsler. The triangles legs are .125" / 3.17mm long, the case is copper and the lead bullet is held with three segmented crimps. In excellent condition. *estimate-* 170-220

The box is strong and has only light soil, while the rounds are in very good condition. [photo 70%] *estimate-* 300-400

79⇨ Holding 5 shells with a raised "flaming bomb" headstamp, a copper head and a red and orange patterned paper body, this 2-piece half cover white **6mm Flobert Extra fine shot box** by G.F.L. has red and white, top and side labels. The top has a black rubber stamp noting double shot, and the back side has a white overlabel noting in Italian, the shot size as #13. The about 95% complete side seal has a small black stain at one corner and the top has light soil, so in good to very good condition. [photo 70%] *estimate-* 40-60



⇨ **80** Holding in a grey plastic tray 48 brass cased shells with a yellow top wad and a 'GFL' logo headstamp, this 1-piece **6mm Flobert Doppia Forza** (double shot size) box is blue, yellow, black and white. The contents are excellent, and while the box has a little edge wear and a scuff, it is in good condition. [photo 70%] *estimate-* 30-50



81⇨ With 48 original, 'U' headstamped rounds in nice condition, this 1-piece, 50-size **.25 Stevens Short box** by Remington Arms Co. is green, red and white. With a few rubs and some edge wear, it is in good condition. [photo 70%] *estimate-* 50-70

92⇒ Appearing full of copper cased rounds with copper-washed lead bullets headstamped ' \diamond', this **Western .22 BB cap box** is tan with red and dark blue print. 97⇒ Perhaps missing only a few ' D ' headstamped brass-cased blanks which have a roll crimp holding the pinkish topwad, this **blue and white C-I-L** box has bilingual print. DB-CIL-8-S-2-a, but with RF-2 inside the *top flap*, and "SUPER-CLEAN" on the bottom flap. In excellent condition. *estimate-* 15-25



98 With the large handwritten "D" in black marker, on the top (only) of this red, white and blue **CCI DART** box [Rainbolt, CCI-1-S-2] once standing for DUMMY, it now holds 5 primed empty cases all with a ' © '[Kass C-10] headstamp. **Three are .22's**, a short and two longs one of which is nickel-plated brass. 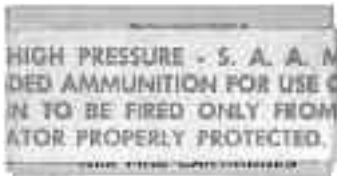

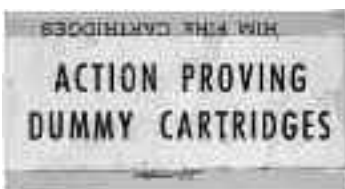

171 Unheadstamped, with a .38" diameter thick-walled turned brass case, and a domed copper primer which is slightly proud of the base and appears to be not completely seated but is just like the few others we have seen, this **.32 or .38 Worrel Auto Rifle** has an about .314" flat nosed lead bullet. 180 Headstamped ' **W.R.A.Co. .38 W.H.V. M-92** ' this **factory high pressure test** has a flat brass primer, a tinned brass case and a CN half-jacketed soft nose bullet. With lead oxidation, it is otherwise in very good condition. *estimate-* 50-80



181 Headstamped ' **W.R.A.Co. .38-55** ' this **factory dummy** has a tinned primer cup with an impressed "W in a O", a blackened brass case with two small mid-case holes, a smooth cannellure, an inner wood distance piece and a tinned GM-jacketed bullet. With a little unevenness to the somewhat thin case blackening, it is otherwise in good condition. *estimate-* 40-70



182 Headstamped ' **W.R.A.Co. 38-55** ' this uncommon **factory function dummy** has a brass primer cup with an impressed "W in a O", a brass case and a GM-jacketed full patch bullet. It has a couple tiny dings, a label and light toning. In good condition. *estimate-* 50-80



183 Headstamped ' W.R.A.Co. .38-56 W.C.F. ' this **factory dummy** has a brass primer cup with an impressed "W in a O", a blackened brass case with two small lower mid-case holes, a smooth cannellure, an inner wood distance piece and a tinned GM-jacketed bullet. With a little unevenness to the case blackening and a hairline neck crack it is still in good condition. *estimate-* 40-70



184 Headstamped ' W.R.A.Co. 38-70 W.C.F. ' this **factory dummy** has a brass primer cup with an impressed "W in a O", a blackened brass case with two small lower mid-case holes, a smooth cannellure, an inner wood distance piece and a tinned GM-jacketed bullet. Interestingly it has an impressed mark slightly to one side of the primer pocket which appears to us to be a light, off-center primer pocket draw strike. 185 A **.38 Extra long Wesson**, with a slightly dished copper Farrington primer, a slight rounded head and a 2.015" long brass case with a deep ring crimp securing the belted lead bullet. With a label, and slightly uneven toning, it is in good condition. *estimate-* 70-100



186 Showing **raised ' U.M.C. S .40-60 H in a dished circle ' headstamps**, this **pair of .40-60 W.C.F.'s** have brass cases and lead bullets, however the copper primed (shown) one has an 2.171" OAL, while the brass primed example has a 2.259" OAL. With toning and marker these are both in good condition. *estimate-* 30-50

These following wildcat or proprietary singles and lots are from the E. L. (Gene) Scranton collection. Some of these are period, but some are unmarked reproductions made on new brass. We are not making note of 'original' or 'reproduction' in our descriptions. Some are on new brass but are contemporary wildcats and so are 'right'. We will not be describing the condition of these as 99% of them are in very good condition with perhaps marker or lacquer on them. Most all of these Gene has identified with a small typewritten paper band slipped onto the case, and we will endeavor to keep the band on the round, but if you receive some without the band you will just have to identify it yourself, although a good many have a factory headstamp. We will also be using Gene's identification for these.

We have used the first letter on the wildcatter's name or the basic case type to sort these into groups, so there may well be some overlap. Perhaps an Ackley shoulder was used on a .284 it might be found in either the .284 grouping or the Ackley lot. You will notice sometimes two or perhaps more of a round listed, but something is different, they are not duplicates. After this selection of wildcats Gene had put-up more wildcats with a directory list for each lot, they will be offered as completed by Gene, and there might well be rounds in those, that could / should go into these.

Abbreviations are: Win=Winchester, Rem=Remington, Imp=Improved, Mag=Magnum, and c.l.=case length. Some of these may be fired or unprimed cases with the proper bullet. We have used Gene's labels to note the length and relative position to the various points of difference.

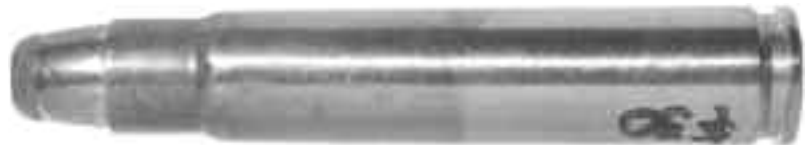

358 This set of **three Krag gauges** are apparently go, and no-go are unmarked but for a handwritten electro-pencil(?) 361 Headstamped ' W.R.A.Co. 30 U.S.G. ', this **.30-40 Scott's patent multi-ball** has a flat brass primer and a turned brass sleeve fitted over the neck, shoulder and upper body. The CN-jacketed outer bullet is slightly loose and the case mouth is a little ragged, however the inner over-bullet was seems intact so all-in-all, in good condition. *estimate-* 30-50



362 This pair of .30-40 Krags are headstamped ' KYNOCH ·30 U.S.A ', and have flat brass primers. Appearing identical but for the CN-jacketed soft nose bullets, the one with the smaller lead tip and longer jacket, weighs about 4.5 grains less than the other. 363 Headstamped ' W. R. A. CO. 5 06 ', this Cal. .30 M-1903 ball has a flat brass primer and a slightly pointed CN-jacketed full-patch bullet with a small impressed "W". One of the dated contract rounds by Winchester, it has a few small stains and light toning but is in good condition. *estimate-* 20-40



364⇒ In an unmarked dark-grey Phosphated steel clip these five **Cal. .22 Hoffer-Thompson M-1903** modified cartridge holders are unmarked, multi-piece blued steel and take the .22 Short rimfire. With a friction fitted tinned GM-jacketed full patch bullet it has a very light pitting, but is still in good condition. *estimate-* 50-80



370 Headstamped ' W.R.A.Co. .30G. 1906. ', this **sales dummy** has a domed brass primer, two small mid-case holes, a wood distance piece, and a tinned GM-jacketed soft nose bullet. With a good bit of the original factory polish and lacquer intact, it has light lead oxidation and a dent in the bullet tip. In good condition. *estimate-* 30-50



371 Headstamped ' **FAL 43** ', this copper-washed steel new empty .30-06 case by Frankford Arsenal Laboratory has an empty Boxer primer pocket. With a dark color it is otherwise in good condition. *estimate-* 15-25



372 Headstamped ' **GE 44** ', this very uncommon copper-washed steel cased Cal. .30 M2 ball has a domed brass primer and a GMCS-jacketed bullet. This is part of the result from a General Electric contract to develop a brass-case continuous die process. With a darkish case coloring, it is in good condition. *estimate-* 90-120



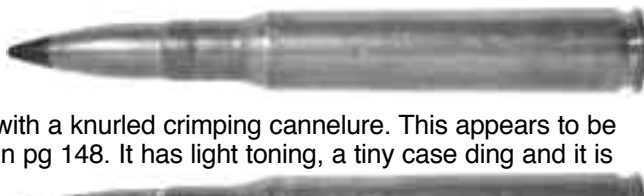

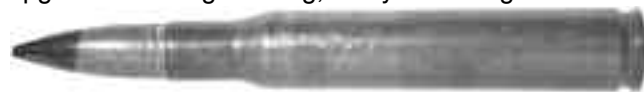

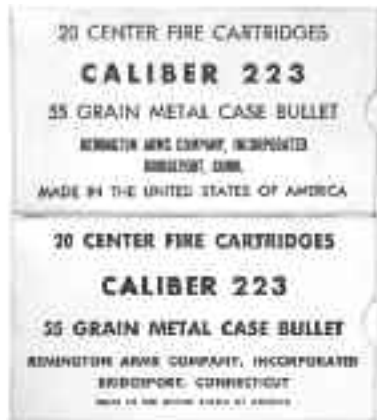

415 A 3 round collection of **.280/333 Jeffery**. Headstamps are;

‘KYNOCHE J·280 NITRO’, ‘JEFFERY ·333 K’, and ‘JEFFERY KN ·333 KN’ [shown]. Both of the Kynoch have flat brass primer

while the KN has a ring crimped brass primer. 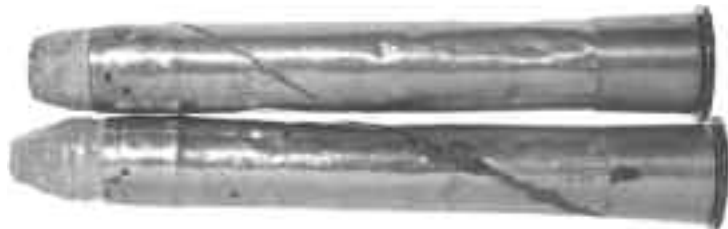

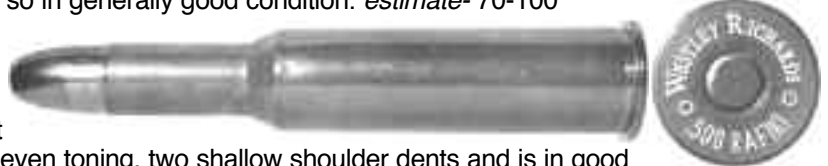

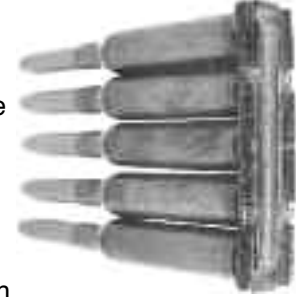

474 Headstamped ' vom Hofe B 7mm Super Expr. B ', this rare, **6x66 Gehmann Super Express** has a flat brass primer, a drawn brass case and a GM-jacketed soft nose bullet held with a taper crimp. Part of his mid-1960's, 6mm experimental series, it is said to have been made by DWM for Gehmann, but that is unconfirmed. With only four known, this has light, slightly uneven toning, and is in good to very good condition. *estimate-* 300-400



475 Headstamped ' DWM 8x57JS ' in the groove, from which the original headstamp was removed, this has a flat brass primer with a black annulus, a drawn brass case and a 2-diameter CNCS-jacketed soft nose bullet which has a light knurled ring on the lower part, near the 'step'. Done by DWM and existing several variations this has uneven toning, a slightly flattened bullet tip, and is in good condition. *estimate-* 20-40



476 Headstamped ' R.W.S. N. ' this 8x57 Mauser has a flat brass primer, a black annulus, and a 2-diameter .318" - 309" / 8.09 - 7.86 mm CNCS-half-jacketed flat nose bullet with a GM ring in the middle of the lead. The uncommon "**Reifring**" bullet by **Val Greiss** [of Miller & Greiss] has oxidization and the case has uneven toning, but it is still in good condition. *estimate-* 40-70



477 Headstamped ' **B. STAHL 13** ' as one of the Stahl numbered case series which used Roman Numerals except for numbers 12 and 13, this **8x46 R** has a large flat brass primer, and a friction fitted slightly belted lead bullet. The oxidized bullet appears lacquered and the case has marker, but this is still in good condition. *estimate-* 15-25



478 A pair of Swiss sporting / target loads, the **9.3x53 M89N** is headstamped ' M+FA 9 9,3/53N 20 '. It has a flat brass primer with a faint impressed Swiss cross, a brass case and tinned GM-jacketed soft nose bullet. Headstamped ' 8 T 10 T ', this uncommon and early **10.4x44 Target** has a very slight dish to the brass primer, a lacquered brass case with a very thin rim and a CN-jacketed soft nose bullet. (for more on this case type see Dixon, Vol. 2, pg. 217). The 9.3x53 has some black spots on the case / bullet, and adhesive remains on the case, while the 10.4x44 has two small case dents and marker. 479 Headstamped at 12:00 ' **JUNG** ', this rare **9.3x82 R Jung** has a flat brass primer, a drawn brass case and a paper patched lead bullet with a 'stepped' tip. A ca. 1900, German gunsmith designed cartridge for a Dr. W. Hollerbach, F. Jung is also sometimes associated with the Austrian firm of Peterlongo. With nice, but darkish case toning, it is in good to very good condition. *estimate-* 250-350



480 Headstamped ' M+FA QC 10,3/60 ' this ca. 1945, **10.3x60 R Swiss** is the Swiss version of the British .450/.400 2³/₈" Express. It has a flat brass primer with an impressed Swiss cross, and a brass case using a segmented crimp to secure the GM-jacketed solid spitzer bullet. With a label, and slightly darkish toning, it is in good condition. *estimate-* 50-80



481 With an ' **ELEY BROS · LONDON** ' headstamp, a domed copper primer, a brass case, and a lightly oxidized lead bullet, this **10.4x38 R Martini-Galland** has darkish toning along with some marker, but is still in good condition. *estimate-* 20-40



482 Headstamped ' **I / 19 / H / 13 /** ', this Austrian, **10.75x52 R Springer** or Mannlicher has a domed copper primer, a drawn brass case and a CNCS-jacketed soft nose bullet with light oxidization. The case has some black stains, otherwise this is in good condition. *estimate-* 70-100



483 Headstamped ' Z * 11.15x36R * ' on the raised portion of the head, this Czechoslovakian version of the **11.15x36 R Fruwirth Carbine** has a flat copper primer with an impressed "F" logo, a drawn brass case with a black stain at the mouth and a flat nosed lead bullet. With marker, it is in good condition. *estimate-* 30-50



484 With a raised ' **G. EGESTORFF · LINDEN** b/H ' headstamp on the "MB"_[Mauser Base] brass case, this **11.5x40 R MB Target** has a large flat brass primer and a flat nosed lead bullet with a smooth grease groove. With a old sticker, adhesive residue, and toning, it is in good condition. *estimate-* 20-40



485 Unheadstamped this **11x40** or **11.5x40 R MB** has a large flat brass primer and a round nose lead bullet with 4 exposed grooves. The bullet at the first lead band [see the arrow] above the mouth is 10.96mm to 11.24mm in diameter measured 90° apart, and is held with two punch crimps that have deformed the high-copper-content brass case mouth. It has adhesive residue, and other than the crimps, it is in good condition. *estimate-* 15-25



486 A pair of **Schülers**. Headstamped ' **D.R.G.M.** ', (signifying patented), the early **11.2x60** has a flat brass primer with a black annulus and a CNCS-jacketed soft nose bullet held by two punch-crimps. The **11.2x72** is headstamped ' **SCHÜLER** * ', has a flat brass primer, and a CNCS-jacketed solid bullet held with a segmented crimp. Both have medium toning and marker, but are in good condition. *estimate-* 20-40



487 With a raised ' **G. EGESTORFF · LINDEN** b/H. ' headstamp on the "MB"_[Mauser Base] brass case, which has an 11.7mm long neck, this **11.5x50 R MB Target** (Rottweil variation) has a large flat brass primer, and a round nosed lead bullet with a smooth groove. With marker and one dark spot, it is in good condition. *estimate-* 20-40





⇐**488** Full, this green, black and white **7x57 R Proof box by RWS** has white-printed red labels warning that these are high pressure loads on the front, back and *inside!* The excellent condition rounds are headstamped 'RWS 7x57 R', and have a reeded {coin-edge} rim. 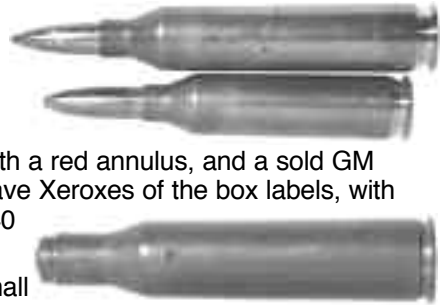

496 Unheadstamped, this **6.5x53 Mondragon** has a small flat brass primer, a brass case, and a CNCS-jacketed bullet. With a few slight stains this is in good to very good condition. *estimate-* 90-120

497 With nickel primer cups, nickel plated cases with three knurled rings, and coreless CNCS-jacketed bullets, this collection of **21 @ 7x57 Mauser hollow dummies** includes 6@ single rounds which are headstamped 'DWM K', and 'DWM 18 K 94' with these other dates; 1895, 1896, 1897, and 1898. 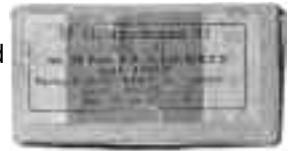

Not a reproduction, it has marker and uneven toning, but is in good condition. *estimate-* 400-500



638 Unheadstamped, this .450 Mars **Short** has a flat copper primer, a drawn brass case with a slight raised ring around the primer pocket, a smooth bullet seating cannellure, 8 Grs. of Ballisitite and a 220 gr. nickel covered bullet held with a taper crimp. Not a reproduction, it has been polished and has dark stains on two sides, otherwise it is in good condition. *estimate-* 300-400

644 Headstamped 'S.F.M ☆ GG[logo] ☆ ', this **6.35mm Gevelot-Delacre** has a domed brass primer, a brass case and a CN-jacketed bullet held by a taper crimp. With a slight stain on the head / primer, it is in good condition. *estimate-* 90-120



645 Unheadstamped, this **semi-rimmed, 6.5mm Sunngard** has a GM-jacketed bullet, a turned brass case and a flat brass primer. For a Norwegian 50-shot pistol, it has marker, and is in good to very good condition. *estimate-* 60-90



646 This **12@ Bergmann collection** includes one **5mm No.2 M-94 grooveless** and one **5mm No.2 M-96**, both are unheadstamped, have copper primers and CNCS-jacketed bullets. **2@ 6.5mm No.3 M-94 grooveless**, both are unheadstamped, have brass primers and CNCS-jacketed bullets. 843 Headstamped ' WINCHESTER 38 SPL+P ', this **Knights Armament**, 5.7mm **Silent** round has a flat nickel primer, a drawn brass case and a fully telescoped GM-jacketed bullet held in a finely-turned light tan plastic or nylon case mouth insert. In very good to excellent condition. *estimate-* 50-80



844 First headstamped 7mm-06 REM, it was recalled due to fear of being fired in the incorrect rifle and most were destroyed at the factory. The second generation was headstamped ' **R·P 7MM EXP REM** ', as this one is, and now Remington and others stamp their cases .280 REM. This example has a flat copper primer, a brass case and a GM-jacketed soft nose bullet. With a little uneven toning it is in good condition. *estimate-* 40-70



845 Headstamped ' W.R.A.Co. 40-90 S.S. ', this **.30 Newton 3 1/4" Express** has a not quite seated brass primer and a GM-jacketed, magnetic "Wire Point" soft nose bullet. With a little uneven toning and seeming to be without powder, it still is in good condition. *estimate-* 90-120



846 Headstamped ' U.M.C.CO. 50-EX. ', this factory polished and lacquered **.50-95 Express board dummy** has a domed brass primer, a brass case with two mounting holes and one deep punch crimp which secures the unmarked, flat copper tubed lead bullet. With a little light lead oxidation, a slight tear at the upper mounting hole, and uneven toning where the lacquer is missing, it is otherwise in very good condition. *estimate-* 40-70



847 Headstamped by hand ' 50 140 ^[over] MM ' as the few others we have seen are, this ca. 1950's - 60's **.50-140 Winchester** has a not quite seated brass Boxer primer. A **Murry McNickols**, of Montana, turned brass case without powder, and a poorly taper crimped flat nose lead bullet. With marker and some unevenness at the mouth it is in good condition. *estimate-* 20-40



848 Headstamped ' **B.S.A . 26** ^[over] · **K ·** ', this Kynoch made **.26 BSA** has a large flat brass primer, a brass case and a CNCS-jacketed bullet with light green wax at the case mouth. With light toning and marker it is in good to very good condition. *estimate-* 60-90



849 This **.500/.416 Krieghoff**, by W. Romey is headstamped ' *Pentagon* WR *Pentagon* .500 / .416 ', has a flat nickel primer, a brass case and a GMCS-jacketed solid bullet. In very good to excellent condition. *estimate-* 15-25



850 Not loaded with powder, this **.500 JEFFRIES**, by Bertram Brass has a not quite seated, flat brass primer with a slight mark, a brass case and a GM-jacketed soft nose bullet. With a three slight dents at the shoulder is in still in good condition. *estimate-* 30-50



851 With a great headstamp, this **Expert, 9.3x70 Mag.** has a flat brass primer, a brass case and a GM-jacketed soft nose bullet. With marker it is in excellent condition. *estimate-* 20-40



852 This set of **6 early 7.62x39** all have copper washed steel cases, brass primers and GMCS jacketed bullets. From factory **3** an Γ {1952} and a K {1956} date, from factory **17** an E {1954} and a K date, and from factory **270** an Π {1955} and a K date. With a little toning to the 17 E [shown] the rest are in good to very good condition. *estimate-* 20-40



853 Headstamped ' OXO unreadable waffenamt 43 10C ' [read clockwise from 12], this perhaps developmental, German, **20x82 Mauser MG151/20 APT** has a 5 stake crimped flat brass percussion primer with a brownish-red annulus, a dark green lacquered steel case with a brownish-red case mouth seal. A segmented crimp holds the black steel bullet which is stamped "avk 14h 43", has a Waffenamt on the steel rotating band and a yellow band on the bullet. With a few scratches on the case, and wear to the bullet colors it is without rust, and in reasonably good to very good condition. [photo 60%] *estimate-* 150-200



854 Full, this is a 1-piece end flap, early **Super Vel**, **.357 Magnum** yellow red and black box. The rounds are headstamped ' SUPER VEL 357 MAG ' , have flat nickel primers, nickered brass cases and 110 gr. GM-jacketed soft nose hollow point bullets. Missing a bit of the outer paper layer where part of an old price sticker once was, it has a little very light soil and is in good condition. [photo 50%] *estimate-* 30-50
